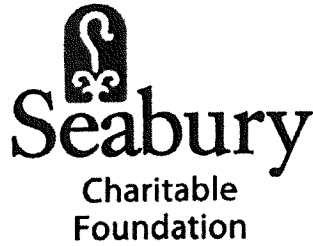

The Connecticut Bar Foundation (CBF) appreciates your bank's participation in the Interest on Lawyers' Trust Accounts and Interest on Trust Accounts (IOLTA/IOTA) program. Enclosed is the CBF 2021 Annual Report listing the legal aid organizations that received funding through this program in 2021.

Unfortunately, the IOLTA/IOTA program experienced a significant decrease in remittance revenue as a result of the precipitous drop in the Federal Funds rate at the start of the pandemic. *This negatively impacted funding for legal aid services at a time when the number of people who qualify for those services increased.* Legal aid services for low-income residents of Connecticut help them secure access to housing, health care, employment, education, rental assistance, other government benefits, and protection from domestic violence and discrimination, among other critical needs. With the increases in the Federal Funds rate anticipated for 2022, we are hopeful that we will start to see a recovery in this vital funding source for civil legal aid.

We are grateful for your bank's continued participation in the IOLTA/IOTA program. *As interest rates rise, please remember that the rate on IOLTA accounts must be at least as high as the rate offered on comparable accounts at your bank.* Any increase can make a significant difference in the ability of the most vulnerable residents of our state to access critical civil legal aid services.

Dear Mark,

Thank you for caring so much about preserving Windsor history! You are an important part of Windsor Historical Society, and thanks to your continued support, our understanding of Windsor's history continues to become richer and more inclusive!

"Coming to Windsor" is an important part of so many people's Windsor story – perhaps yours as well? Sadly, we know very little about the personal experiences of Windsor's earliest English settlers, and even less about the Indigenous peoples who came before them. The few surviving artifacts and scant records, such as Jonathan Brewster's 1635 report to the Plymouth Company, paint a broad picture but offer few details of individual experiences. As Brewster wrote in his best 17th-century grammar:

Ye Massachusetts men are coming almost dayly, some by water & some by land, who are not yet determined wher to setle, though some have a great mind to ye place we are upon, and which was last bought. Many of them look at that which this river will not afford, except it be at this place which we have, namely to be a great towne and have commodious dwellings for many years together.

Thanks to you, we are preserving much more of Windsor's recent history, but it is a huge undertaking. The Society's **community history** program is enabling us to collect and share the personal stories of so many Windsor people of all backgrounds and experiences, like Cheryl Curtis' story about deciding to move to Windsor in 1984:

"... we had read about Bloomfield being this model community, integrated community. So, we had looked there and then we also looked at Windsor and I don't know, now these are childhood secrets: as a child, I went through my history books and I saw this Cape Cod house with a white picket fence and I decided, 'Okay, that's what I want. That's where I want [to live].' So, there was something about Windsor and the Green and the New England charm, and it was a town where there were people of color. I had an offer at Cape Cod Community College and my sister said to me, 'Why wouldn't you want to go and live on the Cape?' And I said, 'But there are no people there who look like me, none of the people [who] interview[d] me.' And I want my child to grow up where there are people who look like her, so...Windsor won!"

Because of your generosity, last year Windsor Historical Society took a bold step and established a new staff position and welcomed Sulema DePeyster aboard as our very first community historian! Sulema, in partnership with other staff and our good friends at WIN-TV, has propelled our community history program to new levels, recording **67 new Windsor stories** like Cheryl Curtis' in the past year alone.

Recording these stories is, of course, only part of the work of the community historian. Making connections with people, transcribing interviews, editing videos, and then making these narratives accessible to the community as coherent stories takes time and skill, as well as up-to-date equipment, software, and the means to make them accessible to the public. Many of these very personal accounts are now available on our own YouTube channel, and others will be featured in upcoming exhibits. **Your support has made this possible – and there is still much more to be done!**

We are just beginning. As we enter our second century and commit ourselves to “doing” history more inclusively, there is much more we can and should do to engage and celebrate the history of all Windsor’s many diverse people.

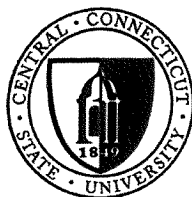

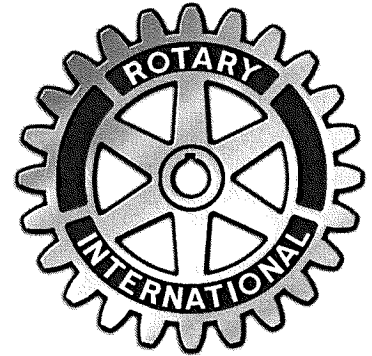
